

## Ryder's Robert Sanchez to join TI board of directors

In 2010, Mr. Sanchez again transitioned to the operations side of the business, when he was named to his current position as president of Global Fleet Management Solutions, the company's largest business segment and a leading provider of truck leasing, rental and maintenance services with operations throughout the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom. He has served as a member of Ryder's executive leadership team since 2003. Prior to joining Ryder, Mr. Sanchez worked as an applications engineer at Florida Power and Light and a controls engineer at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft. He earned an MBA from The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania with a concentration in finance and a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering with a specialization in computer science from the University of Miami.

"Robert's breadth of experience in finance and management along with his background in global operations and markets will make him a valuable contributor to the board's deliberations," said Ruth Simmons, chair of the board's governance and stockholder relations committee.
