- 24 percent reduction in the amount of energy required to design, market and manufacture a semiconductor;
- 20 percent reduction in the amount of water required to design, market and manufacture a semiconductor;
- 95 percent of the company's total waste recycled;
- \$28.2 million in cash and in-kind donations for education, cultural and community initiatives; and
- Naming to Working Mother Magazine's Hall of Fame.
